Thoughts...

I'm developing a new resource for authors interested in self-publishing, especially those writing nonfiction self-help books. The goal is to create content that clearly explains the editing process in a way that empowers authors.

At first, this may seem unnecessary. However, based on my experience working with authors, I've seen how valuable it is for them to have a basic understanding of editing. It:

- Strengthens collaboration between editor and author
- Encourages authors to take a more active role in the process
- Helps authors make informed decisions when hiring an editor—understanding what to look for and what they're paying for
